## ANNUAL PARISH MEETING — 16<sup>TH</sup> APRIL 2010 AT 7.00PM IN THE VILLAGE HALL

**Present:** Simon Bust, David Herbert, Glenys Herbert, Andrew Paris, Di Parrish & Marina Thompson

### **Matters Arising:**

1) Jubilee Tree – has died. David Herbert will source a suitable replacement and then a plaque will be put in place. 2) Bus shelter – now being cleaned by Mr & Mrs Bevan (many thanks). 3) Police speed monitoring – vans & cameras now available. Community Speed Watch to be revitalised and police support will be sought. County Cllr Andy Stewart will be asked if the results from the recent Police presence in Halam can be released. 4) Mrs Di Parrish made comment that it was a pity that the Waggon & Horses didn't function as the local village pub any more.

### **Chairman's Review:**

Simon Bust reviewed the past year. There had been monthly parish council meetings plus addition meetings to discuss specific matters – thanks to all who attended. Planning issues had been important again this year, but the District Council had generally been in agreement with the parish council. Parish Paths Partnership has continued with improvements to Halam's footpaths and associated gates/styles – many thanks to Chris Mercer.

There have been a number of issues with Highways; some progress has been made but there are still some outstanding problems. The more residents who complain to the County Council about problems, then the more likely they are to be resolved – **the number to ring is 08449 80 80 80.**

The precept has been increased for the first time in many years. Some parish council reserves were spent on starting the village hall refurbishment, so it was thought prudent to build up the council's reserves again. Granting funding of £9,000 has now been received so work continues.

The Chairman thanked the parish councillors for their work and support over the year. Thanks also to Mrs Janet Simmons (auditor) and to the clerk, Patrick Rickett, and to Mandy Rickett.

## PARISH COUNCIL NOTES — 16<sup>TH</sup> APRIL 2010 AT 7.30PM IN THE VILLAGE HALL

**Present:** Simon Bust, Andrew Fraser, David Herbert, Glenys Herbert, Andrew Paris, Di Parrish & Marina Thompson

**Matters Arising:** 1) Consultation on Community Infrastructure Levy – Andrew Paris to respond to the District Council: threshold set too low, shouldn't apply to single dwellings; needs to be applied locally to development, not just used centrally, and; should be ring-fenced so that it is used only for local improvements (not lost into central funds) 2) County Council – benches & notice boards – Halam has already been 'ear-marked' for a new bench; Chairman to investigate 3) Bomber memorial – it is now very likely that funding will be available from Building Better Communities

**Village Hall:** Work is progressing. Marina Thompson to source kitchen. A new outside door is to be fitted, thanks to £400 from Cllr Andy Stewart. Volunteers are now needed to help paint and tidy – Marina Thompson to organise a working party
